\* SOC 200 vs. SOC 202: It is recommended that students take the Writing in the Major (WIM) requirement during Junior year or as early as possible during Senior year. Students pursuing the regular BA should take SOC 200. Students considering honors are encouraged to enroll in SOC 202, instead of SOC 200.

\*\* Twenty units of Social Science electives are required for the major. You may take all 20 units in Sociology if you wish. Elective non-Sociology units (10 units maximum) should be social science classes.
